OAD 2017 Call for Proposals

The 2017 OAD Call for Proposals is underway. Stage 1 of the call received a total of 114 proposals. The Task Forces scored these proposals with input from Regional Offices. By the end of June, 40 proposals were selected to move on to Stage 2. The OAD and Regions are currently working with these 40 teams to revise their Stage 2 applications. Revised applications will be submitted for review by the Task Forces, who will select the projects to be funded.



Regional Offices Meeting



She made [poster presentations](#) at the AASTCS5 meeting on Radio Exploration of Planetary Habitability and attended the IDATA project kickoff. She also presented her work at the International Symposium on Education in Astronomy and Astrobiology (ISE2A) in the Netherlands, and presented a lesson at the South Carolina Camp for the blind. AstroSense aims to improve universal access to Science and level the playing field.

- NUCLIO, cohost of **Portuguese Language Office**, organized two international competitions, Dark Skies Rangers Drawing Contest and Dark Skies Rangers Video Contest, to raise awareness of light pollution and the importance of using energy-efficient outdoor lighting.
- **South West and Central Asian ROAD** is co-organizing the UNESCO regional conference on “Astronomical Heritage of the Middle East” from 13-17 Nov 2017 in Yerevan, Armenia
- **Southern African ROAD** is organizing an AstroLab workshop from 6-11 November 2017 at the National University of Science and Technology in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe. It will be followed by GTTP (Galileo Teacher Training Program) a training from 13-17 November 2017.
- **West African ROAD** conducted the OAD funded project 'Hands on Basic Space Science Training for Primary and Secondary School Teachers' (HBSST) held from June 1-3, 2017 at NASRDA-Centre for Basic Space Science and June 5-7, 2017 at River State University of Science and Technology in Nigeria
